## Why Student Voices Matter

---

- For colleges and universities
  - » “Thickens” and contextualizes assessment evidence
  - » Challenges faculty & staff narratives about students
- For students
  - » Creates opportunities during which students can reflect on how choices they are making about their own education
- Requirement - “Mindful listening”

# Administrators, Faculty, & Staff

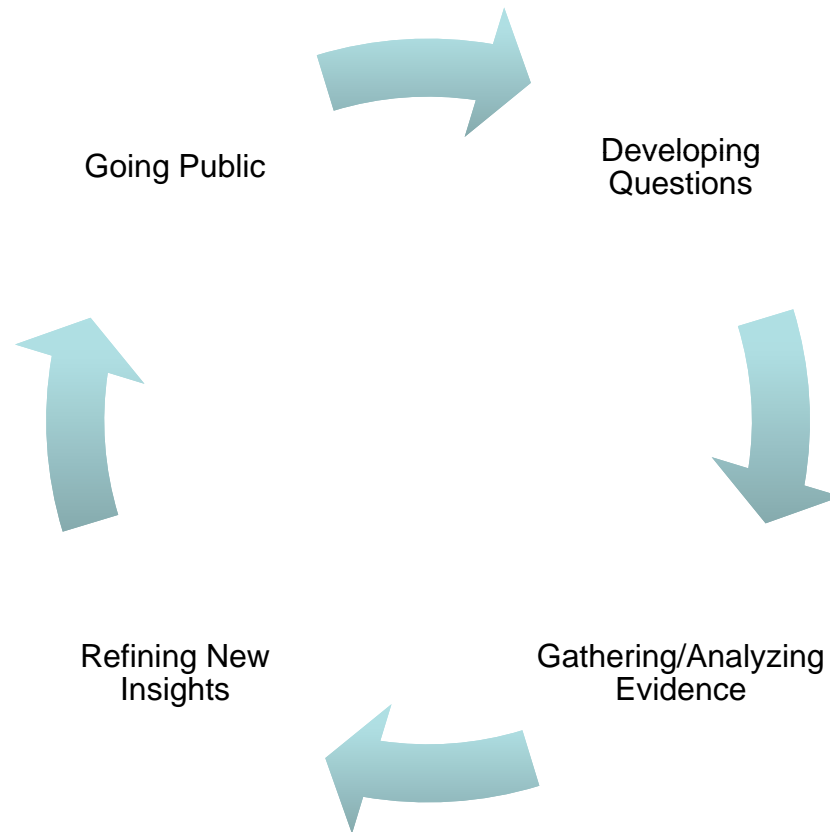
- What have *WE* learned?
